From the desk of First Vice District Governor Bill Bradfield

At the close of my last report I told you that LCIF was developing a video in Michigan for the DAD program (Defense Against Diabetes). They have completed the video since then by filming participants in Michigan and the leaders from districts across the State of Michigan and you can review it on YouTube at Lions Team Up to Fight Diabetes | Diabetes Advocacy. They did a really great job working through the pandemic serving our Lions. It has only

been out for one week and already we are getting great reviews so you should take time out and review it also. A lot of it was developed during online meetings and some site work. The process took about 12 weeks to complete. The information was provided by individual Lions who actually administer all 11 Districts with the DAD program. We can all be proud of our Michigan programs because this video will be used Nationwide and Worldwide.

We have currently spent \$183,000 and have \$67,000 left to spend on programs statewide. We have been very fortunate that LCIF has been very flexible about our time allotted to complete the program due to COVID. We still have some funding available to take the Diabetes Management classes.

In Michigan we presently have 691,070 confirmed cases and 16,906 deaths which has been on the rise and we are 5th nationwide. Nationwide we have 30,223,587 confirmed cases and 550,726 deaths. The Michigan Department of Health and Human Resources number is 888-535-6136. Even if you have had both shots you should still exercise safety precautions daily by wearing your mask, social distancing, and washing your hands. If you are a nurse or first responder you can perform vaccinations at different locations. With the new variants of COVID, we do not know for sure how safe we are so please be careful.

I have been involved in the standard practice of appointing Lions for the various leadership roles in the upcoming year in our district and I would like to thank all of you that have agreed to extend your services for another year.

In closing, I would like to wish all of you and your families a Happy Safe Easter.

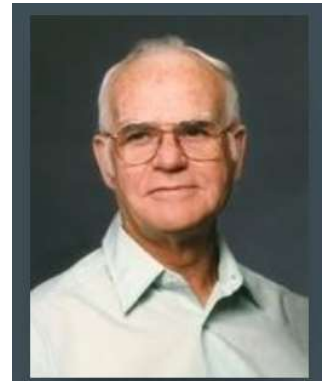


Midland Lions

WHITE CANE SEASON COMING UP

White Cane Week in Michigan will be held April 23-May 2.

There are several types of white canes available. In the early days of white canes, they had wooden canes with a curved handle on it. (The wooden canes were too heavy and not long enough for mobility travel.) Those have since been discarded and there are now collapsible and noncollapsible long mobility white canes. Some have a red tip on the end and sometimes they may have a white ball tip that rolls more smoothly over the ground which gives more sensitivity. White support canes are also an option for some users who are legally blind.

Act 10 of 1937 2 (2) State of Michigan: A driver who approaches a crosswalk or any other pedestrian crossing without taking all necessary precautions to avoid accident or injury to a blind pedestrian carrying a cane or using a dog guide or walker is liable in damages for any injuries caused the blind pedestrian. A blind pedestrian who does not carry a cane or use a dog guide or walker has all of the rights and privileges conferred upon any other pedestrian by the laws of this state. The failure of a blind pedestrian to carry a cane or use a dog guide or walker shall not be treated as evidence of negligence in a civil action for injury to the blind pedestrian or for the blind pedestrian's wrongful death.

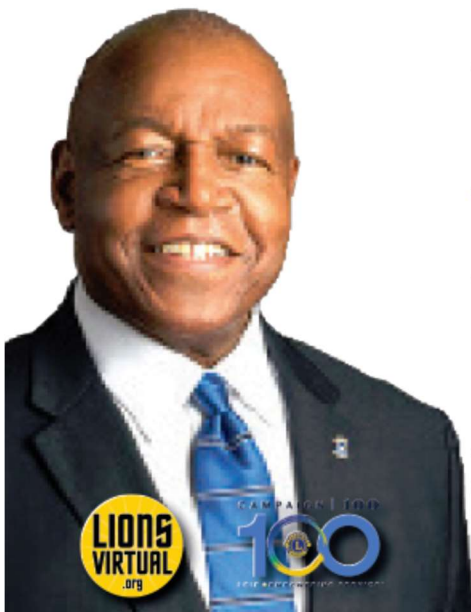
