


## DISTRICT 11 E1 EYE GLASSES MISSION TRIP



### ***DISTRICT 11 E1 EYE GLASSES MISSION TRIP TEAM***

The District 11 E1 Eye Glasses Mission trip just completed a successful six day trip to Merida, Mexico in the Yucatan Peninsula. After approximately a year of preparation, the sixteen Lions, paying their own transportation and hotel expenses, served over 950 clients in Merida that needed eye exams and eye glasses. The project started with donations of eye glasses from throughout District 11 E1. The Ferris University School of Optometry through Dr. Dan Wrubel contributed approximately 1,500 glasses for the trip. The approximately 3,500 pairs of glasses were cleaned and sorted at six different clubs in the District. Using the six clubs gave many District Lions an opportunity to participate in the preparation of the glasses for distribution in Mexico. The team sent ahead over 5,000 pairs of eye glasses to be used for this mission trip. Chair PDG Harry Johnson indicated that the team of Lions and two optometrists served 937 clients during their stay. The oldest was 91 years old and the youngest was 6. This trip was the vision of PDG Harry Johnson, who organized and chaired the details that made the mission trip possible.



## D.A.D. Grant Update

When the LCIF announced the funding of our second Diabetes Grant in 20 month's on January 15<sup>th</sup> they appointed Barry Allen as the Fund Administrator. Barry has a very impressive record of Lion service in all positions for many years and he is currently the Chairperson of the Council of Governors. LCIF also appointed Bill Bradfield as the Project Chairperson for our new grant of \$250,000.00. Bill's background has been Chairman of the District 11E1 Sight Conservation/Diabetes Committee, past president and zone chair. In 2017 Governor Ron Gibson asked Bill to author a grant application for \$45,000/00 for the District also for Diabetes. This grant was approved as well and received very high ratings upon completion. PDG Ron Gibson was the Fund Administrator and Bill Bradfield was the Project Coordinator. In February of 2018 a State wide Steering Committee was formed to process the second grant application that used 11E1's grant as a template. We are now in the implementation stages of this grant. Classes are being scheduled, District Steering Committee meetings are being held, and we are preparing Nutritional Training classes, Diabetes Management classes, Diabetes Educator classes and Health Fairs around the State.

Our new State Grant Budget includes funding for A1C Screenings, Glucose Screenings, and a new website that will have a wealth of information on diabetes that will be helpful to our members and the public. We will be using the expertise of MSU that we used on our first project that was so successful. We have a letter of intent with the university that covers the entire State of Michigan. The class size can range from 10 to 20 participants. The 4 week classes (10) will be held in local communities and run from 11AM to 1 PM. You will learn new recipes and enjoy tasting your cooking as well. The books you receive will be yours to keep. It will be a life style change that will be very rewarding.


The Diabetes Management or PATH Personal Action Toward Health classes will be performed by the Area Agencies for the Aging. This class is a workshop that empowers participants to build lifestyle skills. It is 6 weeks long in 2-1/2 hour sessions weekly. Adults of all ages may attend, including people with Pre-Diabetes, Type 1 or Type 2 Diabetes, family members and caregivers. Certificates will be awarded upon completion.

The training of 5 Lions to become Diabetes Educators will be provided by the American Association of Diabetes Educators (AADE). When the grant application was submitted the cost of training 1 Lion was \$500. Through negotiations we were able to bring the price down to \$99. And now we can train 5 Lions per District.

The class is online in the convenience of your own home. It is 14.5 hours of training and we are told that most people finish in about 5 weeks. Your allowed 90 days from the date you log in. The grant pays for the cost of this training also. It was developed at a basic level for Lions to be able to speak the language of diabetes and promote the providers that will be our partners. This is on a first come first serve and it will enable us as Lions to promote the new programs that we have available. We need you as Lions and your clubs to say we are ready for training in our communities. We thank Ann Roeseler for scheduling the first health fair in May in Coleman. Let's all pull together and make this another stellar event. Go Lions. we serve.

## ADDENDUM 'E' #1 REGION CHAIR ELECTED BY REGION DISTRICT 11E1 CONSTITUTION WORDING:

Page 2. ARTICLE VI Section 3. ELECTION/APPOINTMENT OF DISTRICT CABINET.

The district governor and first and second vice district governors shall be elected at the annual convention of the district. The district governor shall appoint or the district shall elect by the time he/she takes office, the cabinet secretary, a cabinet treasurer, one region chairperson for each region (if the position is utilized during the district governor's term), and one zone chairperson for each zone, in the district, sergeant at arms and such other club members as may be included in the district cabinet. **INASMUCH AS THE OFFICE OF Region Chairperson is a regional elective position, and in order to give the candidate sufficient time in which to campaign, candidates for the office of district governor shall declare their intention whether to utilize region chairperson on or before January 2<sup>nd</sup> of the year in which they seek election; otherwise it is understood that the office of Region Chairperson shall be utilized.**

Page 7, Section 8. APPOINTMENT/ELECTION OF REGION/ZONE CHAIRPERSON.

**Regional Elections shall be held to elect Region Chairs. Candidates are required to secure a majority of votes cast by the members of the region in attendance and voting.** The district governor shall appoint by the time he/she takes office one zone chairperson for each zone and one region chairperson **for each region that did not elect their own.**

## ADDENDUM 'A' REGION CHAIR APPOINTED BY GOVERNOR DISTRICT 11E1 CONSTITUTION WORDING:

Page 2. ARTICLE VI Section 3. ELECTION/APPOINTMENT OF DISTRICT CABINET.

The district governor and first and second vice district governors shall be elected at the annual convention of the district. The district governor shall appoint or the district shall elect by the time he/she takes office, the cabinet secretary, a cabinet treasurer, one region chairperson for each region (if the position is utilized during the district governor's term), and one zone chairperson for each zone, in the district, sergeant at arms and such other club members as may be included in the district cabinet.
