Leadership Opportunity: Our District Needs a First Vice District Governor

As your District Global Leadership Team (GLT), one of our primary responsibilities is ensuring that Lions in District 11-E1 have strong, capable leaders who can guide us into the future. Today, I want to bring attention to an important leadership need in our district:

We currently do not have a First Vice District Governor (FVDG).

Despite outreach and conversations with a number of dedicated Lions, we have not yet identified someone willing to step into this crucial role for the upcoming year. The First Vice District Governor is an essential part of building continuity, supporting the District Governor, and preparing for leadership at the district level.

Why This Role Matters

The FVDG:

- Helps support clubs and district initiatives
- Assists with training, membership, and service goals
- Builds experience to step into the DG role the following year
- Ensures leadership stability and continuity for the district

Without someone in this role, our district faces challenges in planning, representation, and long-term leadership development.

Who Can Serve?

Any Lion in good standing who meets the basic LCI qualifications—and who has a passion for helping clubs succeed—may be eligible. Past club officers, cabinet members, zone chairs, region chairs, or Lions with organizational experience often find the role both rewarding and achievable.

You Don't Have to Be an Expert—Just Willing to Serve

The leadership team and MD GLT provide full training and support. No one is expected to take this journey alone. Many District Governors will tell you they never imagined themselves in the position until another Lion encouraged them or recognized their potential.

We Need Your Help

If you—or someone in your club—may have the heart, experience, and willingness to serve, please reach out. Even a conversation is a good first step. Our district's strength depends on developing leaders who can guide our clubs and support the Lions we serve alongside.

Please contact the District GLT or District Governor if you would like more information or wish to recommend a Lion for consideration.

Together, we can ensure that District 11-E1 continues to grow, lead, and serve with excellence.

The 2026 Club Officer Nomination & Election Process

As we begin planning for the 2026–2027 Lions year, it's time for clubs to prepare for the **nomination and election of club officers**. Establishing strong leadership ensures continuity, healthy club operations, and a smooth transition into the new year. Below is a simple outline of the recommended process to follow over the coming months.

1. Appoint a Nominating Committee

Each club should form a **Nominating Committee**, typically consisting of three experienced members who are not currently seeking office. Their role is to:

- Identify members interested in leadership roles
- Confirm eligibility and willingness to serve
- Prepare a slate of recommended candidates

2. Present the Slate of Nominees

The Nominating Committee should present its recommended slate of officers at a regular meeting. At this time:

- Members may offer additional nominations from the floor
- Candidates should be given the opportunity to accept or decline

3. Publish the Slate at Least Two Weeks Before Elections

To ensure transparency and give members adequate time for consideration, clubs should:

- Publish the full list of nominees in the club newsletter, email, or meeting announcement
- Inform members of the official election date

4. Conduct Club Elections

Elections should take place no later than April, following Lions Clubs International guidelines. Clubs may vote by:

- Voice vote
- Show of hands
- Secret ballot (recommended if multiple candidates are running for the same office)

A simple majority is required for election.

5. Report New Officers in the Lions Portal

2025-2026 Club Excellence Award Criteria

The Club Excellence Award acknowledges the dedication and legacy of service within individual clubs. Excellence Awards honor club leaders who demonstrate outstanding membership growth, impactful service and humanitarian contributions. This year's criteria are:

- 1. **Induct** a minimum of two (2) or 20% new members, whichever is greater (does not include transfer, reinstated, or charter members). Eligibility is determined based on the Club's membership count on June 30, 2025.
- 2. **Or sponsor** a new Lions Club.
- Report a minimum of four (4) service activities in the Lions Portal. Three of these service activities must show participation in each of the three International "Weeks of Service."
 - a. Hunger: January 3-11, 2026
 - b. Environment: April 18-26, 2026
- 4. Report newly elected club officers in Lion Portal by May 15, 2026 of the current Lion Year.
- A minimum of 10% of the club's members complete any three courses in the Lions Learning Center.
- 6. The Club President for the current Lion year must not have served more than two consecutive terms.
- 7. A minimum of two or more club officers (president, vice president, secretary, or treasurer. Of which, one must be the club President) complete Club Officer Training (on-line with Lions Learning Center or in-person as reported by a GLT coordinator) between May 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025.
- 8. Contribute to LCIF a minimum of the Club's membership total on June 30, 2025 of the previous Lion year, multiplied by \$20.

We are pleased to report the following for Bear Lake Kids Camp:



For any new member readers, Lions Bear Lake Camp was Founded in 1982 by the late "Big Al" Kassin and the Lake Orion Lions Club, Bear Lake Camp has been a beacon of hope and adventure for visually impaired youth for 43 years. The camp opened at its current location in 2000, initially welcoming 53 campers.

Building on that foundation, the Lions later expanded their mission to include summer camps for deaf and hard-of-hearing children. We also host a unique weekend camp for hard-of-hearing and visually impaired individuals and their families, providing a supportive environment to meet, share experiences, and navigate common challenges. We now also have many partnerships with other organizations that allow us to host several other summer camp opportunities beyond blindness and vision impairment such as autism, those in foster care, cancer and those affected by grief are only a few examples.

Bear Lake Camp offers a true escape into nature and adventure. Situated on 120 acres with most of the onsite buildings being very near to and overlooking a large private lake. Bordered by vast tracts of state land, the setting feels expansive and secluded. The facilities can house up to 160 individuals in 10 two-story modern dorm style cabins and the dining hall has a capacity of 250 people.

An Unforgettable Summer! Lions Bear Lake Camp Shatters Attendance Record.......

And what an incredible summer it was!!!!!

We are thrilled to announce that the Lions Bear Lake Summer Camp has achieved a **new all-time attendance record** for 2025. After a final review of all summer camp programs, we confirmed that **1,506 special needs children** were served over the course of **11** weeks.

This remarkable achievement **surpasses** the previously announced record of 1,406 children and is a testament to the **passion and dedication** of our staff. The overwhelming interest and demand from families to attend this camp reflects the high quality of our programs and the meaningful impact they have. The kids themselves are the camp's best advertising. Some come in shy and quiet and in a few days are yelling "Pick Me-Pick me." Parents can sometimes be overly protective, but the camp teaches and emphasizes independence. Such as visually impaired or blind getting their own plates, silver ware and food using guide ropes or experiencing Zip Lining and Rock wall Climbing for the first time. Also, with some exceptions. all make their own beds (not a maid or mom at camp!)

Thank you to everyone who made this record-breaking summer possible!

- Overall Impact: More than 15,000 campers and visitors have been welcomed since 2000.
- Culinary Excellence: The food service team, led by Camp Food Director Chrissy Andre, served over 25,500 meals in 2025.
- Leadership Development: An impressive 85% of our summer camp staff are returning campers who have successfully completed our leadership development program, demonstrating the enduring impact of the camp experience.
