The Big Rapids Lions Club recently distributed "Lions Club Teen Bags" to homeless teens in the Big Rapids area.





Sid L. Scruggs III, of Vass, North Carolina, USA, was elected president of The International Association of Lions Clubs at the association's 93rd International Convention, held in Sydney, Australia, June 28-July 2, 2010. Past President Scruggs is a retired military and commercial airline pilot and a graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy.

Using as his presidential theme A Beacon of Hope, Past President Scruggs made service to others – the core principle of Lions clubs around the world – the focal point of his presidency.



A member of the Vass Lions Club, he has held many offices in the association. In addition he has presented at the USA/Canada and Europa Leadership forums and served as an instructor for the Lions Clubs International Leadership Institute and the District Governors-elect School.

In addition to his Lions activities, Past President Scruggs served many years as chairperson of the board of directors of the North Carolina Governor Morehead School for the Blind. He is also a life member of the American Airlines Grey Eagles Association & the Naval Academy Alumni Association.

He has been presented with the Order of the Long Leaf Pine, the highest award given by the State of North Carolina, by the Governor of North Carolina. He is a member of the North Carolina Lions Hall of Fame and in 2010 he was elected to the United States Blind Golf Association Hall of Fame. He has received an honorary doctorate of humanities from World University.

In recognition of his service to the association, Past President Scruggs has received numerous awards including the Key of Nations Award for sponsoring more than 100 Lions members, and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association gives to its members. He is a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

Past President Scruggs and his wife, Judy, also a Lion and a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, have four children and 16 grandchildren.





The pilot class of Leader Dog's Orientation & Mobility (O&M) Training program took place in January 2002. Each of the six clients was paired with an O&M student from Western Michigan University (WMU) and training was supervised by Rod Haneline. Rod had 22 years of experience with Leader Dog as a guide dog mobility instructor and received his master's degree in Orientation & Mobility from WMU. Of the six clients, four eventually returned to train with a Leader Dog and two chose to continue utilizing a white cane.

The first official O&M class consisted of three clients who trained at LDB in September of 2002. They were all instructed by LDB employees. Since this class, Leader Dog's O&M program has continued to grow and now has the capacity to train up to 100 people per year. About 50% of Leader Dog's O&M clients return to train with a Leader Dog.

Initially called the Accelerated Mobility Program or AMP, the program's name was changed to Accelerated O&M Training to better reflect the two components of the program: orientation—knowing where you are in your environment and knowing how to get to where you want to go; and mobility—traveling safely through the environment using a white cane.



After a rigorous application and four-day assessment process, Leader Dogs for the Blind was unanimously voted in as a member of the International Guide Dog Federation (IGDF) in February 1999.

The purpose of the IGDF is to serve people who are blind around the world with guide dogs. The 82 member organizations come from 27 countries on six continents.

The Federation provides a way for members to share knowledge, experience and methodologies so everyone can improve the quality of their instruction and operations.
