The Lions of Michigan Foundation was one of the organizations contacted on the family behalf by Camp Grayling. They immediately contacted the Cadillac Lions Club since Jordan resided in the Cadillac area. The club in turn sent a request for assistance for the Hendrix family to the Foundation.

By the end of the week the Cadillac Lions had received a check for \$1,000 for Jordan's family. This was presented during a fund raiser at the American Legion Hall in Lake City on Saturday night September 28<sup>th</sup>.






### **Cedar/Maple City Lions**
