No organization can rest on its past performance—you must always adapt and outperform your past successes in order to "We Serve".

This will be the last article that I will be writing as Vice District Governor. I am looking forward to moving on to Governor, following the great job that Governor Larry has done for the past year. By all means he has not finished his work in the District. He will be leading the Past District Governors in helping to rebuild and strengthen some of our clubs. One of our main goals for the coming year is to decrease our drops. There are several ways that we hope to help achieve this decrease; 2 <sup>nd</sup> VDG Lion John Monahan is currently working on a program through Lions Clubs International. We also need to be very strong in our orientation of both our current and new Members. If we could have succeeded in reducing our drops we could have without a question had a very strong plus in membership. In 2007/2008, we recruited 111 new members, had drops of 167 and deaths of 21 for a total loss of 77.

As of 6/9/2009, we recruited 119 new members to show an increase of 7.2%. Our drops at this time are 116 or down 44.5 % from last year and our deaths are up to 27 or up 30 % over last year's numbers. Let's continue to battle for new members and shut the rear door on members leaving; we need to hold the line on our drops forever.

We have a great bunch of new Zone Chairs for the coming year and a very strong base of Region Chairs and committees, so let's move forward as a team, grow and have fun. I am looking forward to working with 1<sup>st</sup> VDGE Laura Johnson, 2<sup>nd</sup> VDGE John Monahan, the total cabinet and the members of this great District.

### HEARING COMMITTEE UPDATE—LION GAYLE MORLOCK, CHAIR

During the district convention we collected 5 hearing aids that have been given t o the Speech and Hearing Center at Munson Medical Center. The EarLab was at the convention on Saturday. During the five hours, Lion Paul Hanrahan, audiologist, screened 41 people. That is the most that have been screened during a convention in several y ears. Twenty-eight people were referred to an otolaryngologist/Ear, Nose and Throat (ENT) doctor and an audiologist for further evaluation.

Remember to protect your hearing as hearing loss is the #1 disability in the United States because of noise pollution!

### Camp Tuhsmeheta Programs Begin June 21

Camp Tuhsmeheta, in Greenville, is a District project. (See the articles in the May Lion's Pride). Named for the 4 senses you have when you are blind. It is a camp which offers both summer programs and weekend workshops for visually impaired and blind youths and adults.

We still have campers registering for the 9 sessions offered. We will have lots of kids from Michigan as always, and this year we have several from Indiana, one from Massachusetts and one from Hawaii. Right now the camp is buzzing with energy with new staff arriving for training, volunteers chopping wood and staff getting tents pitched.

Mark your calendar! On August 1st the staff is hosting a 39th birthday party for Camp T. Picnic and birthday cake from noon till 2pm and concert and tours after that. Hope to see you there.

Many 11 E-1 district clubs have been very generous donors and helped to fund camp programs and

offer scholarships. We have an urgent request for scholarship funding for a young man whose father lost his job a month ago. The camper had eye surgery 2 months ago and really needs to come to camp for the support system campers offer each other. He wants to attend 4 sessions and tuition is \$850. 
