## 1<sup>ST</sup> VDG Jim Patterson's Message



I'm continuing on with the same subject as last month: Improving our online presence. I think everyone realizes how important good pictures are to any online posting. That old saying about a picture being worth a thousand words is never truer than online. But here's something that perhaps you haven't thought about:

*Folks who view your club's Facebook page on a smart phone will see something different than if they view it on a tablet and those people will see something different than on a laptop or desk top computer.*

Say what?!?!?

It's True! When someone looks at a Facebook page or Instagram post, etc., those programs send out a signal that detects what device is being used and readjusts the images accordingly. The size of your images becomes important because of what happens to them on the various devices. Don't believe me? View your Facebook page on your smart phone while logged in on your laptop or desktop. Compare what you see. The differences are because a *browser's window is wide* and a *mobile device's window is tall*. Image readjustments are unavoidable.

Further, the latest figures from Facebook tell us that almost 4 out of 5 users will never see your page on a desktop. Fully 79% of Facebook users ONLY access Facebook by mobile phone. It's become far more important to optimize your page for smart phone viewers.

Here are the recommended sizes for Facebook posts that allow the truest readjustment for the different devices. These also work for Instagram.

- For your profile images (you know, that small pic of your smiling face) - 360 x 360 pixels
- For a picture that you put in your post - 1200 x 1200 pixels
- For that banner across the top of your Facebook page - 1242 x 700 pixels

The word pixel (also abbreviated as px) is slang for Picture Element - that single dot of color that make up all pictures. How many of these in your picture determines its size and the amount of detail displayed. Today's cell phone cameras pack one h\*\*\* of a lot of pixels into one picture - way too many to be used effectively by those resizing algorithms.

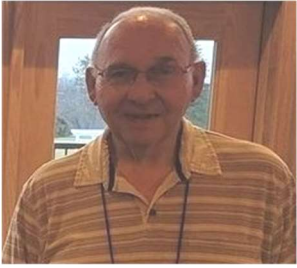
Using social media effectively means you need to prepare your images to the recommended sizes for display before you post them. I'm a Windows user so I'm most familiar with their offerings. Here are some ways to resize that won't cost you a single penny.

- Microsoft Windows users have an app named Photos in their menu. This is pretty easy to use for resizing photos but not much else.
- Microsoft Paint 3D is also included free and allows you to crop as well as resize. It is also easy to use.
- Available to both Apple and Windows users is the web-based program called Pixlr X. It works inside your browser so there is nothing to download or install. It really shines with simple-to-use tools for cropping and resizing. This is my fav and it's free to use! The website is [pixlr.com](http://pixlr.com) (that's P I X L R)

**One more hint:** Save the pictures in the JPG format at the very highest quality possible. If you are using pixlr x, clicking the Save button will bring up a menu for choosing quality. Select the highest quality possible and then move the slider to 100% for zero compression. Compression degrades the quality of the picture. Facebook is going to compress it anyway so why compress it twice?

Next month I'll talk about *cropping* pictures and the *rule of thirds* to focus on what is most interesting.

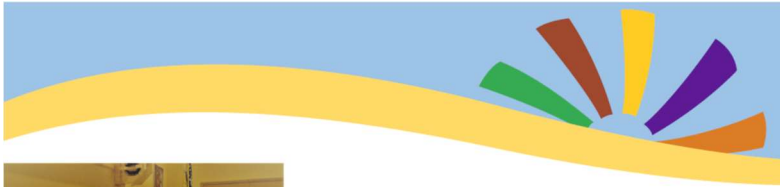
