

Membership Rebate

THIRTY DOLLAR REBATE FOR NEW MEMBERS

I have had several e-mails asking me for a clarification on the \$30.00 rebate for new members. The District 11 E1 cabinet voted a \$30.00 rebate on net total new members to be paid in six month intervals, using the June 30, 2012 membership number for each club.

Example: If you bring in four new members from July 1 to December 31 and don't lose any members, your club would be rebated \$120 for your administrative fund. If you bring in four members and lose two members in that same period, you would receive \$60.00 for your new members. It is the net increase above your June 30, starting membership count.

After your secretary has filed your December membership count with International, he/she should apply for the rebate to the District Secretary, Lion Jim Chipman.

The same policy will be in effect for the January through June net total new members. Lion Jim's address is:



Cedar/Maple City Lions



Advanced (Senior) Lions Leadership Institute – February 22-25 2013

The next Advanced (Senior) Lions Leadership Institute for Lions in the USA will be offered in Oak Brook, Illinois on February 22-25, 2013. Lions Clubs International (LCI) is recruiting qualified Lion participants for the institute. It is a valuable opportunity to build on skills that enhance the leadership qualities at the zone, region and district levels.

The institute in Oak Brook is designated as an Advanced (Senior) Lions Leadership Institute and is targeted to Lions that have completed a successful term as club president, but have not yet attained the position of first vice district governor. Lions who are region and zone chairpersons, as well as second vice district governors are encouraged to apply to this institute. Candidates do not have to hold a position currently may also apply.

Lions Clubs International will provide meals and lodging in strict accordance with to the schedule of the institute. Additionally, LCI will make appropriate hotel reservations for each participant on a twinshare basis. <u>Please note that according to new board policy, a non-refundable participation fee of</u> <u>US\$95.00 will be required to offset these costs for all institutes.</u> This fee will be due no less than four weeks prior to the institute start date. Participants are responsible for all travel expenses to and from the designated venue inclusive to all relevant ground transportation charges.



WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING AT THE LIONS OF MICHIGAN FOUNDATION

At our Oct. 24, 2012 Grants and Assistance meeting, a total of 21,275.83 was awarded to 7 needy recipients in the state for needed eye surgeries. At the quarterly Board of Trustees meeting on Oct. 27, 2012, it was announced that the proceeds from the dissolution of Welcome Homes would yield about \$26,000 to each of the state projects, those being Bear Lake Camp, Lions of Michigan Foundation, Leader Dogs, and the Eye Bank. Also, raffle tickets for sight and hearing will be sent to clubs in November, with sales to be completed next March and the drawing the end of April.
